### **DANCER'S PROFILE**

Very articulate, RUBE FRANCO explained his full and complex career so even I could understand it. His calm disposition belies a wideranging background full of unusual experiences which make him unique.

Presently living in Stanton and in California for 50 years, he was born in Bisbee, AZ, about 100 miles south of Tucson. He grew up in Los Angeles and went to James Garfield High. In college, he played tenor sax and engaged with small groups who "jammed" together and played private parties.

Health conscious, he doesn't drink or smoke. Trim and slim, RUBE stays fit by working out at the gym and taking walks on the beach/sand which provides strenuous and stimulating leg exercise. In his youth, he boxed. He did confess, however, that he always has ice cream in his fridge – but along with veggies. West Coast Swing is his preferred dance but he also does Latin.

Following Air Force basic training, he was assigned to Ft. Belvoir Engineering School. He was subsequently stationed in South Korea during the Korean War, and trained in Japan in auxiliary generators operations. Back in the states, he was assigned to a communications squadron providing auxiliary power for spy communications in field operations at Ft. Bragg. After leaving the military, RUBE worked as an environment tech and tech writer at McDonald Douglas and North American Rockwell. While at Douglas, RUBE was involved with others in developing the bomb release doors for the atom bomb military aircraft, and single-point fueling system on commercial aircraft.

Leaving government work behind, an enterprising RUBE owned and operated several small businesses, and worked for various large banks and insurance companies for whom he traveled extensively. Before retiring, he was an investment broker and an underwriter for a nationwide mortgage company.

Besides business travel, he vacationed in the Bahamas, the New England states and all the Hawaiian Islands, of which Maui is his most romantic and favorite. RUBE has three children and counts his role as a parent high among his life achievements.

His humor is dry and says Jay Leno makes him laugh. He strongly dislikes people who lie. When asked what his "bucket list" consists of, he said he wanted to live another ten years. Not fond of cooking, he doesn't like waiting for food in restaurants either which goes along with his hyper busy personae. RUBE loves to read and leans toward the technical, mechanical and investment fields along with biographies of successful business people and military men.

Although a bit hesitant to have this interview, I found RUBE open, honest, and well-spoken with integrity in all he said. In short, RUBE is one happy guy with himself and with his life.

# Home as Your Disaster Kit: May, 2015

(Thank you to Dan Snyder for information below)

In 2011, FEMA polled civilians on barriers to emergency preparedness. When asked why they did not prepare for disasters, the most common response was that preparing was too expensive. Using items already in your home reduces cost and time spent preparing. Items around the house can also be used for the secondary effects of earthquakes such as fires, electricity disruption, or water service / sewer system damage.

In this month's bulletin, with the support of Councilmen Tom LaBonge and Mitchell Englander, the City of Los Angeles Emergency Management Department (EMD) lists the uses of common household items immediately following an earthquake.

- Water heater: A typical home water heater can provide 30 or more gallons of clean drinking water. To use the water in your tank, first turn off the electricity or gas to the water heater. Then, close the supply valve to preserve the cleanliness of the water in the tank. Next, get the air out of the tank by opening any hot water tap such as the kitchen sink. (Caution: The water coming out of the tank may be very hot.) You can use a short water hose (e.g., the supply hose to a washing machine) to drain the water from the tank. Use a screwdriver or coin to operate the drainage valve. If you do not have a hose to transfer the water to jugs or pots, use a shallow pan to collect the water. Allow the tank to fill before restoring power to the water heater.
- **Inexpensive Styrofoam coolers** filled with **ice** can prolong the shelf life of meat and dairy products if your refrigerator is not operating because of a power outage.
- Use insulated lunch bags with ice to keep temperature sensitive medications cool if power is out.
- A bucket with a lid can serve as a portable toilet.
- Household chlorine bleach can be used as a disinfectant (dilute 9 parts water to 1 part bleach) to purify water.
   Use 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach per gallon of water. Do not use scented or color safe bleaches, or those with added cleaners.
- Trash bags make good ponchos. Remember to poke a breathing hole over the mouth and nose before putting the bag on. Trash bags are also useful for sanitation and separating dry goods from wet ones.
- Use **sticky notes** and **markers** to notify family members where to meet, or to inform rescue workers that the home has been evacuated.
- A **tape and ruler** splint can temporarily immobilize an arm. Alternatively, cardboard and nylon socks or a book and tape can immobilize a limb.
- Hydrogen peroxide or vinegar can be used to clean wounds. Clean water can also be used to clean wounds.
- **Diapers** and **sanitary pads** can be placed over wounds.
- Holding a scarf over your mouth will reduce smoke inhalation in the event of a fire.
- Baking soda helps to neutralize acids.
- Use **plastic wrap** to dress burn wounds. The wrap prevents infection.
- Do not forget can openers if relying on canned food. Granola bars, dry unsalted nuts, seeds and dried fruit (like raisins) are all options when refrigeration is unavailable. Avoid foods with high salt content. CDs or other shiny objects can be used as mirrors. Their reflections in the light can also be used to signal for help.
